



Dr. Gary A. Lieber, DPM, DABLES



Dr. Lieber was born and raised in the Bronx, New York and graduated from **The Bronx High School of Science in 1971.**

Dr. Lieber's bachelor of science in biology, with a minor in chemistry came from the State University of New York at Oneonta where he was on the Dean's list. He was the Sports Director, did basketball play by play and was an on the air personality with WONY AM and FM.

While an undergraduate Dr. Lieber was awarded **New York State Regents scholarships for dentistry and osteopathic medicine.**

Dr. Lieber's podiatric education was at the Pennsylvania College of Podiatric Medicine, now the Temple School of Podiatric Medicine, where he graduated in 1981. His research paper on soft tissue shadows in foot x-rays accepted for publication in the **Journal of the American Podiatry Association**, prior to his graduation.

Following graduation Dr. Lieber had a residency in Podiatric Surgery at the Broad Street Hospital and Medical Center in Philadelphia. During this time Dr. Lieber published a second paper on soft tissue shadows in podiatric radiology which was published in the **Journal of Foot Surgery.**

Beginning in 1982 Dr. Lieber practiced podiatric medicine and surgery in Delray Beach Florida for 35 years until he merged his practice with **Certified Foot and Ankle Specialists** in May of 2016.

Since 1994 Dr. Lieber has been board certified by the **American Board of Lower Extremity Surgeons** and is a **Diplomate of the American Board of Lower Extremity Surgery.**

In 2002 **Dr. Lieber became a Fellow of the American Professional Wound Care Association.**

Dr. Lieber listens very carefully to the patient's description of symptoms and uses the appropriate combination of **35 years of experience**, medical judgment and technology to arrive at a diagnosis.

Some of the medical conditions that Dr. Lieber treats are:

peripheral neuropathy
vascular issues such as painful leg cramp, swelling of the legs,
Lymphedema
heel pain,
neuroma (burning pain at the ball of foot and toes)
fracture of feet and toes
care of skin wounds and ulcers
Diabetic foot care
Ingrown nail pain
Painful corns and calluses
Treatment of fungal infected nails

Dr. Lieber specializes in **Minimal Incision Surgery** (MIS) of the feet. This technique allows correction of painful bunion, hammertoes as well as painful corns and calluses.

These procedures are performed on an outpatient basis and many can be performed in the office through incisions no more than 4 mm in length without the need for pins and screws. This technique also allows for immediate return to ambulation. The Minimal Incision Technique is especially beneficial for patients over the age of 65

Some of the surgical procedures Dr. Lieber performs are:

Correction of bunion deformity
Straightening of hammertoes
Permanent relief from painful corns and calluses
Excision of neuroma
Permanent removal of ingrown nails
Laser removal of plantar warts
Removal of splinters, glass and other foreign bodies from the lower extremity

For 35 years Dr. Lieber has used a combination of medical, surgical and biomechanical approaches towards treating all types of foot pain and other foot problems. During this time, he has been the physician of the last resort for hundreds of patient's and has been able to diagnose the problem and bring them relief.

Treatment can be as simple as nutritional supplements, prescription medications, different types of dressings, immobilization with soft casts and braces or surgical correction for painful foot deformities that can and years of chronic pain.

Dr. Lieber is on staff at **Delray Medical Center** as well as **Pinecrest Rehabilitation Hospital**

Dr. Lieber was among the founding families of the Boca Raton Synagogue. Since 2000 he has been the head Coach or assistant Coach of the Yeshiva High boys varsity soccer team

He is also a member of the Association of Orthodox Jewish Scientists and the Maimonides Society of the Boca Raton Synagogue.
